Description
BP Fuel voucher for volunteers
Priority for organisations: to help them get any event or programme started to help them become self sufficient
Discretionary funds to support community organisations who offer services or support in the Waipa district.
Funds projects that: strengthen environmental partnerships, raise environmental awareness, encourage participation in environmental initiatives in the community.
Practical, on-the-ground projects that maintain and restore the diversity of our natural heritage and enable more people participate in recreation, enjoy and learn from our historic places, and engage with and value the benefits of conservation
A community internship may be full-time for three months or six months, or part-time for up to 12 months.
DIA will offer intensive advice and support and will work with other government agencies, tangata whenua, local authorities, funders, businesses and local organisations to support the community achieve their locally-led initiatives. In partnership communities put their plans in place, they will also be able to request funding investment to support them achieve their community or hapū goals.
Assists private land owners undertaking conservation projects on their properties that are within the Waikato district boundaries.
Primarily supply local and regional councils and major replanting projects. 99% of their plants are native eco-sourced.
Government-funded grants to support voluntary and not-for-profit organisations working in local communities and neighbourhoods delivering community-based social services that contribute to achieving locally-determined outcomes
Must contribute to at least 1 of the following: environmental outcomes our community wants to achieve, and how they prioritise the actions to achieve them or a district where growth is managed effectively and natural resources are protected and developed for future generations.
Support initiatives relating to NZ flora and fauna.
For schools and community groups projects where action for the environment is part of learning
Protect, conserve or care for our natural, cultural and physical heritage, or allow us to better understand and access the resources.
One-off grants to projects which directly enhance and/or benefit the environment or provide environmental education
For Enviroschools to fund provides one-off grants to projects that directly enhance and/or benefit the environment or provide environmental education.
Supports New Zealand communities by funding smart ideas, projects and initiatives. Considered if fits into one of these categories: 1. Bring together communities, 2. Care for our Environment, 3. Make our Communities Safer

Conservation projects based in the Waikato region.
Improve the quality and availability of water in our water bodies (lakes, rivers, streams, groundwater and wetlands).
Support sport, education and community sectors.
Local community conservation groups based and working in New Zealand engaged in hands-on ecological restoration or conservation. Do not fund national or regional umbrella groups.
Funding is distributed through Regional Councils - contact your Land Management Representative
Organisations who seek to improve water quality of the rivers, preservation or planting of native plants, reduction of waste from landfill, community gardens, walking/cycling tracks to preserve the natural environment, and increase accessibility to the natural environment, restoration/protection of the natural environment.
Diverse range of charitable causes in the areas of health, education, sports and community (which includes arts, culture heritage and environment).
The fund supports whānau, hapū and iwi projects designed to reclaim, revive, preserve and promote the use of traditional Māori knowledge and practice in indigenous biodiversity management.
Aims include (but are not limited to) assistance towards the maintenance and improvement of the natural environment
Large scale project funding. eg, Puniu River Care received grant of \$741,000.
Protect and manage, in perpetuity, special places of ecological significance. Key priorities include preservation of access waterways and coast, protection of biodiversity, heritage sites and landscapes of significance to the community.
Since 1990 the fund has protected over 340,000 ha of indigenous ecosystem through legal and physical protection (ie direct purchase or covenanting).
Not running any further rounds. But we will still consider initiatives that meet points of reference on a case by case basis. Would have to meet the tight investment focus criteria developed for Environmental or Educational initiative.
Fund provides protection for Māori landowners through the use of 25 year renewable kawenata (covenants). Funding is also available for fencing.
Exists primarily to improve New Zealand game bird habitat and secondarily to improve the habitat of other wildlife.
Grants to landowners for cost of planting and establishing trees, and indigenous forest regeneration. Aim to encourage planting of natives, trees for erosion control, and environment-focused planting.
Partnership Grants Fund: Focus on partnerships between organisations and groups to enable an increase in tree planting whether through research, innovation, or sector development.
Promote sustainable development in the Pacific and New Zealand, while conserving the natural environment and cultural heritage of its people.
Conservation projects involving eco-sourced pohutukawa and northern or southern rata trees.
To assist preservation and protection of the natural environment of New Zealand by community based, non-profit groups. Conservation, environment projects and activities funded. Most costs/expenses are eligible.
Projects and activities in the Children & Youth, Cultural, Sports & Outdoors, Educational and Environmental categories with a focus on Access, Participation and Inspiration.
Primarily directed towards individuals, groups and organisations in country areas and rural towns. Grants are made for projects and activities in the following categories: children, care, elderly, community, conservation, counselling, education, up to a maximum grant of \$1,500.
Grants to purchase, create or improve community assets that have regional or national significance. It provides grants for these capital expenditure projects with a total cost of \$3 million or more



<p>Funding consideration will be given to community organisations which:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Encourage and support community-led initiatives</li> <li>Strengthen participation across diverse communities</li> <li>Inspire communities to take pride and ownership in Hamilton. <p>Supports volunteer community groups and individual landowners undertaking ecological restoration through animal and plant pest control.</p>
<p>Purpose of fund is to encourage and promote the conservation of New Zealand's natural environment. Funding is provided for local habitat protection groups working to protect significant conservation areas in their community.</p>
<p>Is managed by the Project Crimson Trust.</p>
<p>Funding initiatives that increase community vibrancy, quality of life, resilience, participation and inclusiveness in the areas of: Arts and culture, Education, History, Social services, Sports and recreation, Youth, Environment.</p>
<p>Available for projects that will enable events, activities and legacy projects that connect and build New Zealanders' understanding of the following key themes:</p> <p>New Zealand's Dual Heritage – Shared Future. The first meetings between Māori and Europeans, the arts, science, technology and mātauranga of two great voyaging traditions (Pacific and European), whakapapa and identity.</p>
<p>Priority projects which: are cost effective, ecological deliverables, (i.e. practical projects that protect, manage and enhance natural &amp; physical environment of the Waikato River catchment), high community support, clear evidence of wider and sustainable ecological benefits over time, not fully funded by the Trust (i.e. have contributions from other sources, which could include "in kind" actions), raise environmental awareness and/or increase environmental knowledge.</p>
<p>Supports conservation projects or activities for conservation in Waikato</p>
<p>The purpose of the Waikato River Authority is to: set the primary direction through the Vision and Strategy to achieve the restoration and protection of the health and wellbeing of the Waikato River for future generations. Fund rehabilitation initiatives for the Waikato River in its role as trustee for the Waikato River Clean-up Trust.</p>
